

What a start to 2021 we have had. Though we are more used to it, these days continue to be quite the roller coaster. The greater country and world, as well as our small Hopkins community have had some high highs and low lows. Between the pandemic, a return of frequent mass shootings, ongoing political strife and division, and locally, the loss of important community members and friends, the lows have been troubling and exhausting. But we have not been without highs, or good things. We have seen another baby born among us, more and more of the church family has gotten vaccinated, the warmer Spring days meant getting outside, Sunday School started back up, and ground is breaking for our Food Pantry building. Despite the heavy clouds and dark days, God's light and hope break through time and time again.

That is what this upcoming church season of Eastertide is all about. "Eastertide" is the 50 days between Easter and Pentecost and is meant to keep the party going for longer than just Easter Sunday. Through Eastertide, we celebrate Jesus's resurrection from the dead and triumph over our sins! We celebrate Easter for the triumph and glory, for the miracle of resurrection, but we don't talk as often about what God conquering death with Jesus's resurrection means for us in times like we have had for the last year and what the resurrection means for us all year long.

In a year full of death and despair, of grief and loss, of division and conflict, we may benefit from thinking of the Easter story a bit differently. Perhaps we identify even more with the stories of the Last Supper/ Maundy Thursday and Good Friday than with the happy celebration of Easter. We are now all the more familiar with the tense and unsure feelings the Disciples and followers of Jesus felt in that 3 day gap between the crucifixion and resurrection.

Perhaps that is why this year has felt so long and arduous. Like the Disciples were told before Jesus died that he would return in 3 days, at the beginning of this pandemic we were told it was a 2-3 week shut down to get it under control and then we could roll away the stones of our front doors and go back to normal life. But here we are, a year later, still stuck in that limbo, waiting for the full resurrection of normal life to come.

This is where the significance of Easter can become a true help for us today. Yes, Jesus's resurrection was perfectly on time, unlike returning to normal for us this year, but no matter how long it took Jesus to return, the story of Easter is as powerful and celebratory as it is, because it reminds us not just that Jesus can return from the dead, or that the oppressors and arbiters of injustice did not have the last say, BUT is a proclamation to us, that as Jesus conquered death and injustice, Jesus brought all of us the promise of new life. As Jesus conquered death through resurrection, Jesus proclaimed to all of us, death and grief and suffering and injustice do not have the last word. God, and God's love and hope and justice and peace, do. That new life and hope can always break through.

Though it may feel like the longest three days of waiting for resurrection right now, the Easter story is a promise that we can hold onto during this long roller coaster ride. No matter how low the lows or long the ride, God promises that new life will come, we will find new normals, we will find joy and peace again, and we will make it through together. As always, thanks be to God for the ways we have seen the new life and hope among us already.

I am so thankful that I get to be on this journey with all of you.

At the first Pentecost over 3000 people were baptized, creating the first church.

This year, Pentecost is on May 23.

We will be celebrating Pentecost in a couple of special ways. 1. Pentecost will be our summer kick-off as we move to our summer worship schedule and location:

10am, both churches together, at Common Ground.

2. To celebrate the original Pentecost and the continued work of the Holy Spirit among us, we will also be offering Baptism for any/all of the 6 new babies that have come into our church family in the last year. Any adults who would like to be baptized are also welcome. (Continues below)


