INTRODUCTION

This Lenten Devotional was inspired and based on the children's book, "Images of God for Young Children" by Marie-Helene Delval and illustrated by Barbara Nascimbeni. The book is described as: "It is impossible to know what God looks like. But the Bible describes many other ways that God is revealed to us. God is joy and wisdom. God is light, and bread, and breath. We have seen God's face in Jesus Christ. This book uses simple language to help young children discover these images of God in their world."

Though the book is written for young children, I read it and realized how good of a reminder these images are for all ages, especially during Lent, a time focused on our relationship with God. A great way to connect with God is to start seeing God more in all that is around us. It is an important reminder that God is not an old man sitting in the clouds, but is part of all creation and works in and among us to bring about good and righteousness in the world.

THE DEVOTIONAL

The Devotional goes through the 40 days of Lent. You may not know that the 40 day count between Ash Wednesday and Easter does not include Sundays, as those are thought of as "mini-Easters" focused on the upcoming joy of the resurrection instead of the somber reverence taken on through the rest of Lent. This Devotional follows that tradition and gives a daily devotional for Monday through Saturday.

Each day includes the text and paired illustration for each of the 40 images of God shared in the book, a Psalm that connects to the theme, a short reflection written by Pastor Kelsey, and a prayer from the #PictureLent series that is based on the Psalms this year.



DAY 29: GOD IS A SHEPHERD

MAR. 22



PSALM 23

1 The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want. 2 He makes me lie down in green pastures; he leads me beside still waters;

3 he restores my soul. He leads me in right paths for his name's sake.

4 Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I fear no evil; for you are with me; your rod and your staff— they comfort me.

5 You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows.

6 Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, and I shall dwell in the house of the Lord my whole life long.

A shepherd always walks near his sheep to encourage them.
He counts them to make sure that not a single one has strayed.
He takes them to graze in the best grassy meadows so that they will give the best milk.
Like a shepherd, God wants to lead us where life is the best so that we can give the best of ourselves.

REFLECTION:

Shepherds are a special image for God because of how much meaning that role means for God and for us, the sheep!

Shepherds guide us to what we need to thrive, they keep watch for danger from outside, they keep their eye on all the sheep of the flock and go after any that wander astray, they know their sheep well from what they look like to their unique personalities. God is the greatest and best Shepherd of the largest flock, bringing us into God's house of goodness and mercy all our lives.


PRAYER:

REFLECTION:

When we think of Kings, there are some pretty questionable characters out there. Even (maybe especially) within the pages of our Bible. Kings and other political leaders have done a lot of good and a lot of bad throughout history. To hear God is a King, a very human role, though for much of history thought to be God-ordained, could feel like a bit of an oxymoron. That is why God is the best ideal of a King. The greatest King with the biggest Kingdom, the King with the most honor and glory, but also a King that doesn't feel the need to be ostentatious or over-controlling. God as King shares with us our free will and helps us to contribute to building the Kingdom.


PRAYER:

REFLECTION:

PRAYER:

Read the prayer to yourself slowly and with deep breath between each line.

Yet you lead me to relief from cruelty,
from suffering, from fear, from doubt, from
faithlessness, from injustice.
For I cannot save myself without your grace.
Unveil the blessed image you have left on me
and empower me to live into your namesake.
In the name of the Christ, I pray. Amen.³¹


PRAYER:

MAR. 26



PSALM 5:1-4, 11-12

- 1 Give ear to my words, O Lord; give heed to my sighing.
- 2 Listen to the sound of my cry, my King and my God, for to you I pray.
- 3 O Lord, in the morning you hear my voice; in the morning I plead my case to you, and watch.
- 4 For you are not a God who delights in wickedness;

evil will not sojourn with you.

- 11 But let all who take refuge in you rejoice; let them ever sing for joy.
- Spread your protection over them, so that those who love your name may exult in you.
- 12 For you bless the righteous, O Lord; you cover them with favor as with a shield.

When we are about to fall, when we are sad or frightened, we need someone to take our hand, to comfort us and reassure us.
God wants to do that for us.
Sometimes this is difficult to believe.
But if there is still so much evil, death, and grief in our world, it is only because
God has not had the last word yet.

REFLECTION:

Though we often attribute this image to Jesus, that does not mean that God is not also Savior. God saves us from our brokenness. God saves us from our loneliness. God saves us from our sins and mistakes. God does not only save us as individuals, but God works to save our churches, our communities, our world, and bring us to better places of love, justice, peace, and harmony. As the illustration shows, when the sea is choppy, either inside of us or around us, God will always be our lighthouse, guiding us away from harm we can change course to avoid and shining a light to guide us back home, back to safety, back to relationship with God.


PRAYER:
